How does this help education in the arts?

Event benefits the United Arts Council's arts education programs

Research has indicated that including art and music instruction in a child's school day makes a big difference in students' overall academic performance. According to *Americans for the Arts*, children who participate in the arts in school are:

4 times more likely to be recognized for academic achievements

4 times more likely to participate in math/science fairs

4 times more likely to win an award for writing

3 times more likely to be elected to class office

3 times more likely to go on to higher education
